
1) Getting to the Olomouc Region Authority building

Regional Authority building is situated straight opposite to the Olomouc railway station (Olomouc hl.n.). Here is some advice:


- arriving to Olomouc by train, you can see the Regional Authority building when leaving the station right opposite to the train station (leave the railway station behind)
- arriving to Olomouc by bus, take a tram number 4 and go to the "hlavní nádraží" tram stop
- arriving to Olomouc by car, you can park your car at underground parking in front of the Regional Authority building, which is paid and marked or
- official visits can park at the back parking of the Olomouc Region Authority building (for GPS set Smetanova 4, Olomouc, arriving here you can see the gate, where you go in, see the map 2)




Map 1 – position of Olomouc Regional Authority building on the map (including internet link) next to the Railway station

Olomouc is in the centre of Moravia and it is surrounded by dense network of roads and highways (see map).


Approximate distances are:

Praha - Olomouc 277 km

Brno - Olomouc 76 km

Ostrava - Olomouc 100 km

Hradec Králové – Olomouc 140 km

C. By Car

The traffic rules in the Czech Republic are similar to the European rules (driving on the right side of the road, transportation of children, using seat belt, precedence at the roundabout, etc.). It is mandatory to drive with lights on also during the day and to keep speed limit (50 km/h in town or village / 90 km/h outside town or village/ 130 km/h on the highway – frequent radar controls). There is zero tolerance of alcohol in blood during driving in the Czech Republic. Highway stickers is a must when you want to use the high speed roads. You can buy it at border crossings, petrol stations or any post office. The label have to be placed on the front windscreen, the price is 1200 CZK for one year, 350 CZK for one month, 250 CZK for ten days.
